OHIO'S BUCKEYE TRAIL HIKE. JOIN. VOLUNTEER.

WHAT IS THE BUCKEYE TRAIL?

Traversing over 1,400 miles and linking the "four corners" of Ohio through 47 counties, the Buckeye Trail (BT) is the longest loop hiking trail in the country. The trail follows wooded footpaths, historic railroad corridors, canal towpaths, rivers and lake shores, country roads, and multi-purpose trails within both rural and urban settings. The BT hosts 900 miles of the 4,800 mile North Country National Scenic Trail and 300 miles of the 6,800 mile American Discovery Trail along their routes through Ohio.

In 1967, the BT was designated as Ohio's State Trail, and in 2000, it was designated as Ohio's Millenium Legacy Trail. Recently, in February of 2022, the BT was designated as an Ohio State Recreational Trail by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources.

Our vision for the BT is a sustainable hiking trail that provides a public, safe and unique experience throughout the state highlighting the diverse landscapes, people and stories of Ohio.

WHAT IS THE BUCKEYE TRAIL ASSOCIATION?

The Buckeye Trail Association (BTA) is a nonprofit organization formed in 1959 to build, maintain, pro-tect and promote Ohio's long distance hiking trail: the Buckeye Trail for all Ohioans.

We provide great opportunities for outdoor recreation, education, engaging through volunteerism, and local economic benefits in partnership with a variety of partners, agencies and communities all along the BT. We are creating a legacy for future generations to enjoy Ohio's great outdoors with help from people like you.

GUIDELINES FOR USING THE BT:

Camping is permitted at a growing amount of over 100 designated campsites along the BT. More campsites are still being developed to meet the increased demand for long distance backpackers to camp beside the trail every night. Please practice leave-no-trace ethics. Take only pictures and leave only footprints. Remember that BT Hikers serve as Buckeye Trail ambassadors.

ARE HIKING MAPS AVALABLE?

The BT is divided into 26 sections. Waterproof BT Section Maps show the trail route, public roads, and towns. An invaluable trail log within each map describes points of interest including campsites, water sources, parking, emergency numbers and unique places of interest.

Follow the Blue Blazes!

Look for the 2" x 6" painted blue blazes on trees and utility poles along the trail around the state from the Hocking Hills, Cuyahoga Valley, Miami & Erie Canal towpath, Wayne National Forest, and many more Ohio gems, all connected by the BT. You have probably passed these blazes without having known before!

HIKE THE BT! WHO MAY USE THE TRAIL?

The BT is open for all to hike, at no cost, made possible through the cooperation of federal, state, local agencies, private landowners and the tireless work of volunteers that share the vision of Ohio's Buckeye Trail. Other allowable uses of the BT depend upon what each landowner allows.

The most popular use of the BT is day hiking, but there is a growing interest in extended backpacking trips, trail running, and thru-hiking the entire loop.
